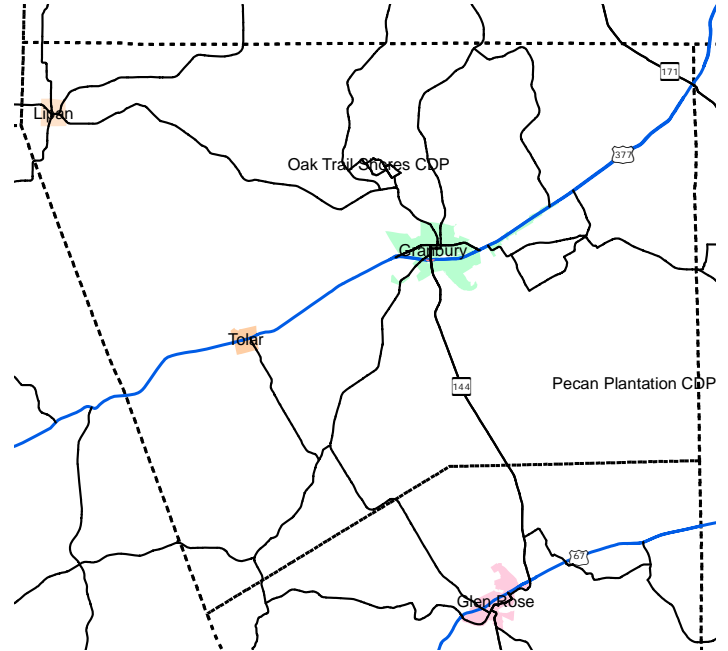
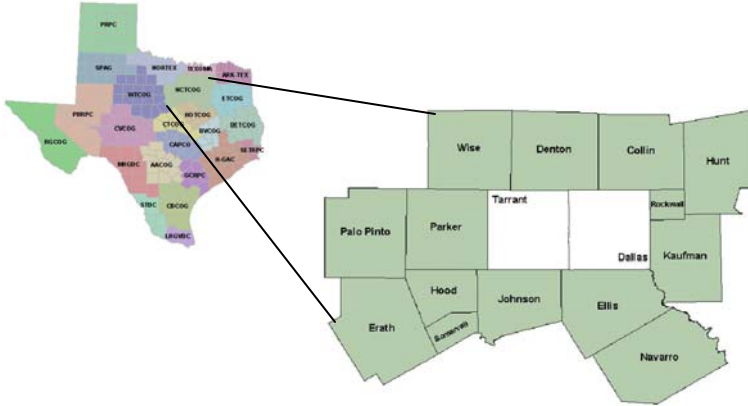

Hood County had an estimated population of 41,100 in 2000. The region consists of 437 square miles with a population density of 94.05 residents per square mile compared to a statewide density of 79.54. This county ranked 68<sup>th</sup> in 2000 population compared to all 254 counties in Texas. This area is a rural county. This county also ranked 243<sup>rd</sup> in size by square miles when compared to all counties in Texas. The major employer for Hood County hiring 250 or more employees is Wal-Mart Supercenter employing approximately 400 employees.

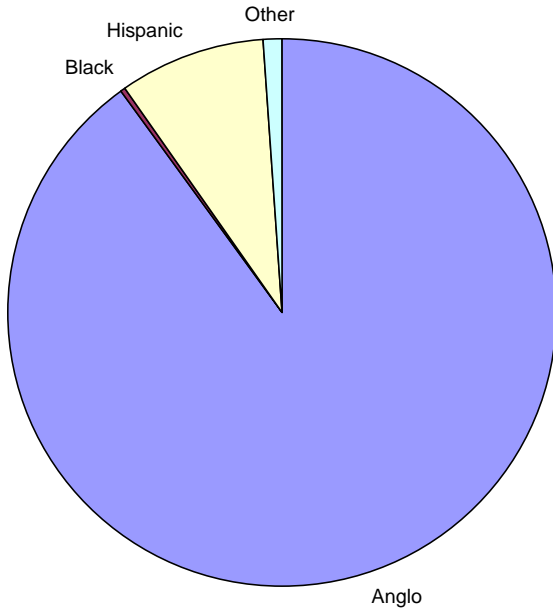

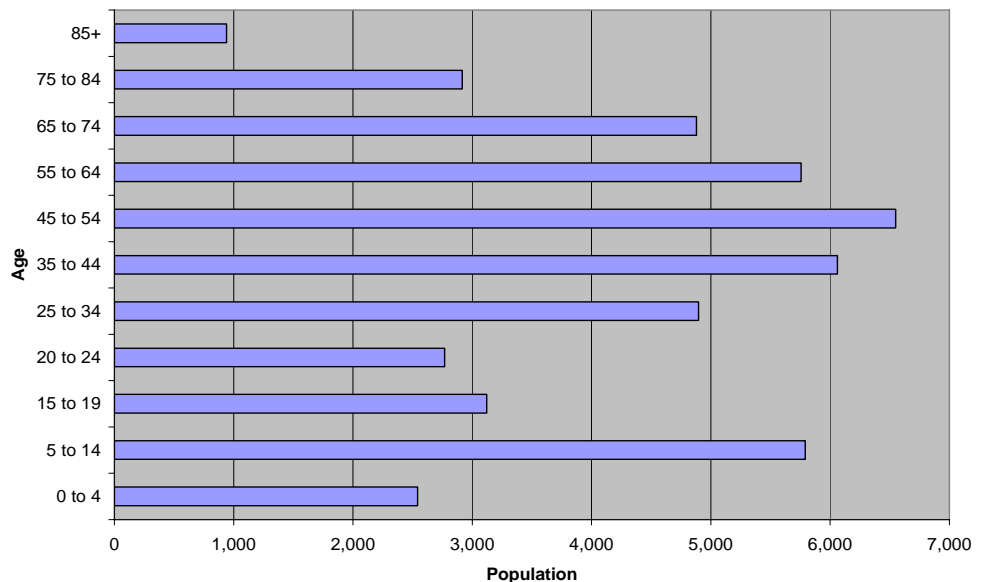

**Personal Income:** According to the most recent data released by the BEA 2002, Hood County's total personal income, excluding farm, was \$1,250,837,000 which represented an increase of \$107,334,000 when compared to the 2000 total personal income, excluding farm, of \$ 1,143,503,000. For Statewide personal income, the total of \$590,412,991,000 for 2000 and \$620,660,661,000 for the year 2002, shows an increase of \$30,247,670,000. This indicates that Hood County has a personal income showing a rate change of 9.4 percent compared to the statewide income at a rate change of 5.1 percent for the same period. Income from all government and government enterprises for the area was a total of \$62,873,000 for the year 2002. This was an increase of 15.4 percent from the 2000 figure of \$54,474,000. 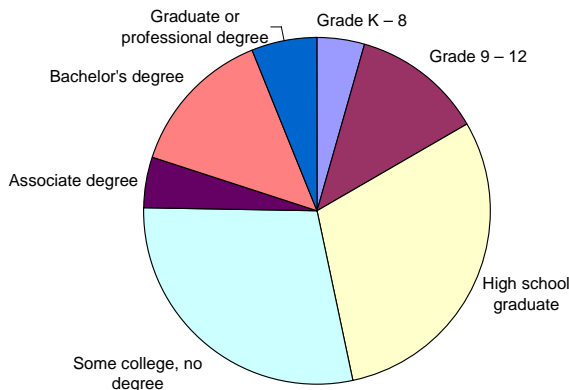

**Government Transfer Payments:** The Hood County region received over \$214,142,000 in transfer of payments in FY2002 which reflected a \$4,877 per capita transfer payment compared to the Texas per capita payment of \$3,595. Transfer payments includes the total amount of government allocations to people who qualify for income assistance. This consists largely of supplemental security income payments, family assistance, general assistance payments, food stamp payments, and other assistance payments, including emergency assistance. ### Poverty Population:

The U.S. Department of Census estimated a 2003 poverty population for the Hood County region for people of all ages at 5,113 persons. That figure represents 11.1 percent of the non-institutional population compared to a Texas percentage of 15.4 percent for people of all ages. 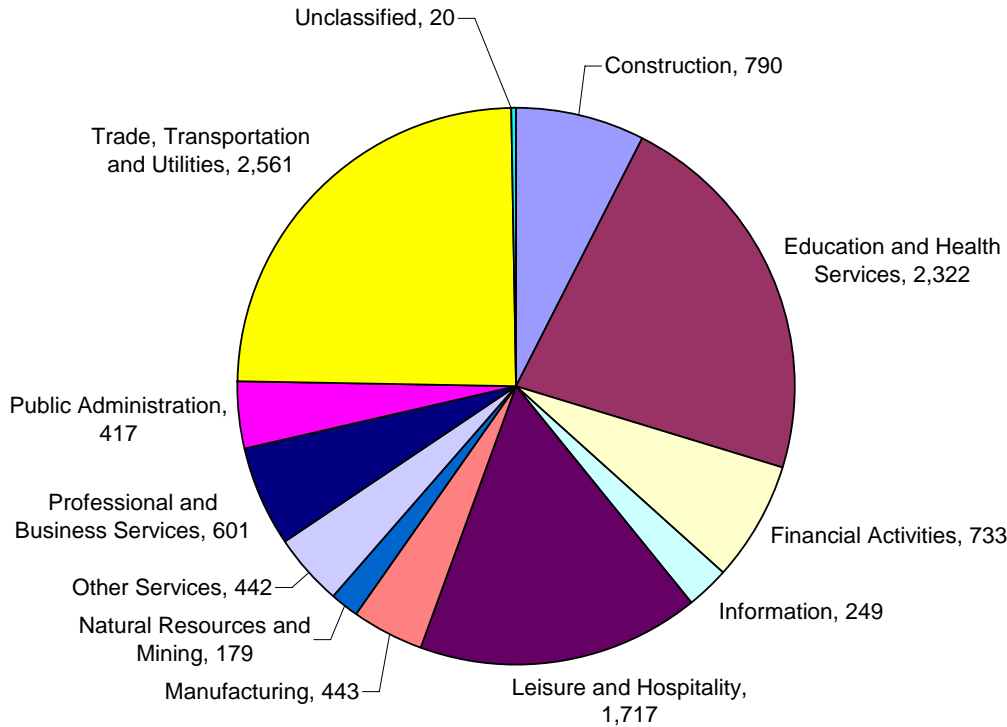
